INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding resolutions to be proposed at the AGM of the Company to be held at Library, Grand Hyatt Hong Kong, 1 Harbour Road, Hong Kong on 18 June 2008 at 10:00 a.m..

LETTER FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

On 25 June 2007, resolutions were passed by the shareholders of the Company giving general and unconditional mandates (“previous general mandates”) to the directors of the Company to:

- (a) allot, issue and deal with additional shares of HK\$0.01 each (“Shares”) in the Company and to make or grant offers, agreements, options and warrants not exceeding 20% of the aggregate nominal value of the share capital of the Company in issue at the date of passing of the relevant resolution on 25 June 2007;
- (b) repurchase Shares not exceeding 10% of the aggregate nominal value of the Shares in issue at the date of passing the relevant resolution on 25 June 2007; and
- (c) add to the general mandate for issuing Shares set out in (a) above the number of Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to the repurchase mandate set out in (b) above.

The previous general mandates will expire at the conclusion of the forthcoming AGM and the purpose of this circular is to, among other things, request your support to renew the general mandates relating to issue and repurchase of Shares at the AGM as referred to below.

PROPOSED GENERAL MANDATE TO REPURCHASE SHARES

At the AGM, it will be proposed, by way of an ordinary resolution, that the Directors be given a general and unconditional mandate to exercise all powers of the Company to repurchase Shares on the GEM of the Stock Exchange up to a maximum of 10% of the issued share capital of the Company at the date of passing the ordinary resolution (the “Repurchase Mandate”).

The Repurchase Mandate, if approved, will continue in force until (a) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company following the passing of the resolution in relation to the Repurchase Mandate; or (b) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by any applicable law or the bye-laws of the Company to be held; or (c) being revoked or varied by ordinary resolution of shareholders of the Company in general meeting prior to the next annual general meeting, whichever occurs first.

The Company may only repurchase Shares on GEM if:

- (i) the Shares proposed to be repurchased by the Company are fully paid up;
- (ii) the Company has previously sent to its shareholders the explanatory statement in relation to the Repurchase Mandate; and
- (iii) the shareholders of the Company have in general meeting approved the Repurchase Mandate and the relevant documents in connection therewith have been delivered to the Stock Exchange.

An explanatory statement containing information relating to the Repurchase Mandate and as required pursuant to the GEM Listing Rules is set out in Appendix I to this circular. That explanatory statement provides you with information reasonably necessary to enable you to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the resolution relating to the Repurchase Mandate.

PROPOSED GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE NEW SHARES

At the AGM, it will also be proposed, by way of ordinary resolution, that the Directors be given a general and unconditional mandate to exercise all powers of the Company to issue new Shares up to 20% of the aggregate nominal value of the issued share capital of the Company on the date of the passing of the ordinary resolution (“New Issue Mandate”). In addition, it is further proposed, by way of a separate ordinary resolution, that the New Issue Mandate be extended so that the Directors be given a general mandate to issue further Shares of an aggregate nominal value equal to the aggregate nominal value of the Share repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate. Any issue of new Shares subject to approval from the Stock Exchange for the listing of and permission to deal in such new Shares.

For the sake of clarity, the proposed new issue of 200,000,000 consideration shares, which shall be voted in SGM on 28 May 2008, are excluded from this calculation. Based on 1,705,000,000 Shares in issues as at the Latest Practicable Date and assuming that no further Shares are repurchased or issued prior to the Annual General Meeting, subject to the passing of the relevant ordinary resolutions to approve the mandate to issue Shares at the Annual General Meeting, the Directors will be authorised to allot and issue up to a limit of 341,000,000 Shares under the general mandate to issue Shares.

DIRECTORS PROPOSED TO BE RE-ELECTED

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the board of directors of the Company comprises five executive directors, namely, Mr. Li Nga Kuk, James, Mr. Li Wo Hing, Mr. Li Tai To, Titus, Mr. Zhang Zhenzhong, and Mr. Leung Sze Yuan, Alan; one non-executive director, namely Mr. Chen Minshan; and three independent non-executive directors, namely Mr. Fan Wan Tat, Mr. Tam Wai Leung, Joseph and Mr. Chan Kim Chung, Daniel.

Pursuant to Article 99 of the Company’s Bye-Laws, Mr. Li Wo Hing and Mr. Tam Wai Leung, Joseph shall retire from office by rotation at the Annual General Meeting and being eligible, offer themselves for re-election. However, Mr. Li Wo Hing, who is retiring by rotation under Article 99 of the Company Bye-Laws, is not seeking for re-election as director (the reason of resignation is set out in the Appendix II of this circular).

Pursuant to Article 102 of the Company’s Bye-Laws, Mr. Zhang Zhenzhong and Mr. Leung Sze Yuan, Alan, being the newly appointed directors, shall retire from office by rotation at the Annual General Meeting and, being eligible, offers themselves for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

Pursuant to Rule 17.46A of the GEM Listing Rules, a listed issuer shall disclose the details required under Rule 17.50(2) of the GEM Listing Rules of any director(s) proposed to be re-elected or proposed new director in the notice or accompanying circular to its shareholders of the relevant general meeting. Biographical details of the retiring directors to be re-elected which are required to be disclosed under the GEM Listing Rules are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

REFRESHMENT OF LIMIT TO GRANT OPTIONS UNDER THE SHARE OPTION SCHEME

The purpose of the Share Option Scheme is to recognise the contribution of the executives and employees of the Group by granting share options to them as incentives or rewards. As at the Latest Practicable Date, apart from the Share Option Scheme, there is no other scheme for eligible participants to subscribe for shares in the Company. Under the rules of the Share Option Scheme:

- (i) the maximum number of Shares which may be issued upon the exercise of all outstanding options granted and yet to be exercised under the Share Option Scheme and any other schemes of the Company cannot exceed 30% of the Shares in issue from time to time. No options may be granted under the Share Option Scheme or any other share option schemes of the Company if such grant would result in the above limit being exceeded;
- (ii) subject to Shareholders' approval, the maximum number of Shares in respect of which options may be granted under the Share Option Scheme shall not exceed 10% of the Shares in issue at the date of the relevant approval (the "Scheme Limit"); and
- (iii) the Scheme Limit may be refreshed by Shareholders in general meeting, on condition that the total number of Shares which may be issued upon exercise of all options to be granted under the Share Option Scheme and any other share option schemes of the Company under the Scheme Limit as refreshed shall not exceed 10% of the total number of Shares in issue as at the date of approval of the "refreshed" Scheme Limit, excluding any options previously granted (including those outstanding options lapsed or cancelled) in accordance with the terms of the Share Option Scheme and any other share option schemes of the Company.

The Scheme Limit has never been refreshed since the adoption of the Share Option Scheme. The Directors were authorised to grant share options of 80,000,000 Shares, representing 10% of the 800,000,000 issued share capital of the Company before the refreshment of the Scheme Limit. consideration shares, which shall be voted in SGM on 28 May 2008, are excluded from this calculation. Assuming no further issue or repurchase of Shares at any time up to the Annual General Meeting, upon refreshment of the Scheme Limit by shareholders at the Annual General Meeting, the Company may grant options entitling holders to subscribe for up to a maximum of 170,500,000 Shares, representing 10% of the total number of Shares in issue as at the date of Annual General Meeting. Consequently, the aggregate options granted represent 4.5% of issued share capital after the refreshment, excluding the proposed new issue of consideration shares.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company confirmed that no share option granted has been exercised, lapsed or cancelled.

The Directors consider that the Company should refresh the Scheme Limit so that the Company will be more flexible in providing incentives or rewards to participants for their contribution to the Group and enable the Group to recruit and retain high-calibre employees and attract human resource that are valuable to the Group.

The refreshment of the Scheme Limit (as refreshed) is conditional on:

- (a) the passing of an ordinary resolution to approve the refreshment of the Scheme Limit (as refreshed) by the Shareholders at the AGM; and

Pursuant to the Bye-Laws, a resolution put to the vote at the AGM shall be decided on a show of hands unless a poll is (before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands or on the withdrawal of any other demand for a poll) demanded:

- (a) by the Chairman of the meeting; or
- (b) by at least three shareholders present in person or by its duly authorised corporate representative or by proxy for the time being entitled to vote at the meeting; or
- (c) by any shareholder or shareholders present in person or by its duly authorised corporate representative or by proxy and representing not less than one-tenth of the total voting rights of all the shareholders having the right to vote at the meeting; or
- (d) by any shareholder or shareholders present in person or by its duly authorised corporate representative or by proxy and holding shares in the Company conferring a right to vote at the meeting being shares on which an aggregate sum has been paid up equal to not less than one-tenth of the total sum paid up on all the shares conferring that right.

RECOMMENDATION

The Board believes that the resolutions for the New Issue Mandate, the Repurchase Mandate, the Extension Mandate, the re-election of the retiring Directors and the refreshment of the Scheme Limit are all in the best interest of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. This is an explanatory statement given to all shareholders relating to a resolution to be proposed at the forthcoming AGM authorizing the Repurchase Mandate.

This explanatory statement contains all the information required pursuant to Rule 13.08 and other relevant provisions of the GEM Listing Rules which is set out as follows:

1. EXERCISE OF THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

If the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full, on the basis of 1,705,000,000 Shares in issue as at the Latest Practicable Date prior to the printing of this circular for ascertaining certain information contain herein (“Latest Practicable Date”). For the sake of clarity, the proposed new issue of 200,000,000 consideration shares, which shall be voted in SGM on 28 May 2008, are excluded from this calculation, and assuming no Shares are issued or repurchased between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of AGM, a total of 170,500,000 Shares (representing 10% of the total issued Shares as at the Latest Practicable Date) will be repurchased by the Company during the period from the date of passing the resolution in relation to the Repurchase Mandate up to (a) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company following the passing of the resolution relating to the Repurchase Mandate; or (b) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by any applicable law or the bye-laws of the Company to be held; or (c) when it is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution by the shareholders of the Company in general meeting, whichever is the earliest.

2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and its shareholders for the Directors to have a general authority from shareholders to enable the Company to repurchase Shares in the market. Repurchases of Shares will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and its shareholders as a whole. Such repurchases may, depending on the market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or its earnings per Share.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Any repurchases will only be funded out of funds of the Company legally available for the purposes in accordance with the memorandum of association and Bye-Laws of the Company, the applicable laws of Bermuda and the GEM Listing Rules.

4. EFFECT OF EXERCISING THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the Company’s audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2007) in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

Assuming that there is no issue of Shares between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of passing the resolution in relation to the Repurchase Mandate, an exercise of the Repurchase Mandate whether in whole or in part will not result in less than the relevant prescribed minimum percentage of the Shares being held by the public as required by the Stock Exchange.

5. DISCLOSURE OF INTENTION

None of the Directors and, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, none of their respective associates, have any present intention, if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the shareholders of the Company, to sell any Shares to the Company or its subsidiaries.

6. DIRECTOR'S UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the GEM Listing Rules, the memorandum of association and bye-laws of the Company and the applicable laws of Bermuda.

7. TAKEOVERS CODE CONSEQUENCES

If as a result of a repurchase of Shares, a shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of the Hong Kong Code on Takeovers and Mergers (the "Takeovers Code"). As a result, a shareholder, or a group of shareholders acting in concert, depending on the level of increase in the shareholder's interests, may obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, to the best knowledge and belief of the Directors, Zhang Jie held 266,666,667 Shares, representing approximately 15.64 per cent. of the total issued share capital of the Company. On the basis that the issued share capital of the Company remains unchanged up to the date of the Annual General Meeting, in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full, the attributable shareholding of Zhang Jie would be increased to approximately 17.38 per cent. of the total issued share capital of the Company. Accordingly, on the basis that Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full, the attributable shareholding of Zhang Jie shall remain at a level not exceeding 30 per cent. of the total issued share capital of the Company and he will not be obliged to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

However, the Directors have no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent that would result in a mandatory offer being required under the Takeovers Code. The Directors also have no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent that will result in the number of Shares in the hands of the public falling below the prescribed minimum percentage of 25 per cent.

Save as disclosed above, the Directors are not aware of any other condition that will trigger a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code as a result of the exercise of the Repurchase Mandate.

RESIGNATION OF RETIRING DIRECTOR

Mr. Li Wo Hing has tendered his resignation as an executive director of the Company due to his personal reasons.

The Board and Mr. Li confirm that:
